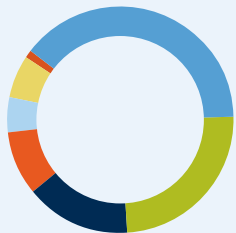

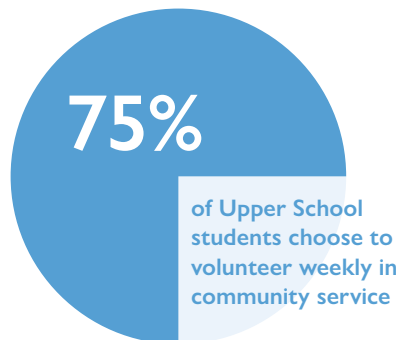
FINANCIAL AID

Special Programs

Outdoor Education

Chadwick's Outdoor Education Program challenges students to develop their skills in leadership, collaboration, critical thinking and self-reliance through experiential learning in the wilderness. Students participate in one wilderness course per year, culminating in a three-week backpacking expedition and unique rite of passage during their senior year. Chadwick's program is accredited by the Association for Experiential Education.

HONORS, ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND HIGHEST LEVEL COURSES

Honors Courses

Students must receive departmental approval to take an honors course in mathematics and languages.

Chadwick School offers honors courses in the following subjects:

Algebra 2, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, Chinese, French, Spanish, Economics, English 11 and English 12, Environmental Science, Physics/Chemistry/Biology (PCB) at levels 2 and 3, Theater at levels 3 and 4, and Visual Arts at levels 3 and 4.

Advanced Placement and Highest Level Courses

Students must receive departmental approval to take an Advanced or AP course in mathematics and languages, including courses beyond our typical sequence, such as Multivariable Calculus through GOA.

Online Courses At Chadwick

Chadwick's membership in the Global Online Academy (GOA) and Malone Schools Online Network (MSON) provides opportunities for students to take advanced courses with peers from other independent schools around the world. Both GOA and MSON are designed as honors courses and appear as GOA or MSON courses on our transcript.

Reporting Disciplinary Actions

Disciplinary action is defined as suspension or expulsion. If a college or university asks a question regarding disciplinary action, Chadwick will respond to the question, and we strongly recommend that the student respond directly, as well.

Calendar and Schedule

- Modified Block Schedule, including four days with three academic periods (80 minutes each); one day with six academic periods (45 minutes each); two co-curricular periods.
- Semester calendar with an A-F grading system. Minimum passing grade is D-.
- Note that effective the 2024-25 academic year, Chadwick has shifted to reporting year-long grades.

Grading

- All AP, Post-AP, Advanced and Honors courses and courses requiring an AP class as a prerequisite are awarded a full extra point (4.0 scale) in determining weighted GPA.
- Chadwick does not report rank or name a valedictorian.
- GPAs are calculated on a weighted 4-point system, based on all Chadwick courses reported on the transcript.

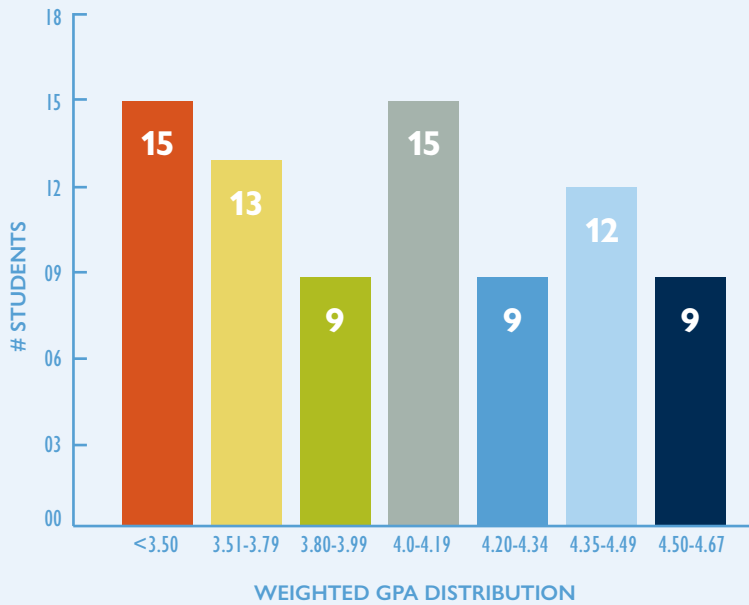
